What you need to know about Wednesday Nights at St. Andrew



On Wednesday evenings at St. Andrew we get a lot done in a short time. At 6 PM, we have a potluck dinner and fellowship time. Lots of children join us for dinner and you get to meet whoever is new at St. Andrew or visit with the long-timers. You will hear their stories, share who you are, and feel like you belong in a very short time. Each family brings something, even if they, like the pastor, stop in at the grocery store at the last minute for something pre-made.

Dinner is finished by 6:30 and we have either a Bible study, watch a video about something related to the Bible, play a game, or watch part of a movie. Regardless, we always finish by 7:30 PM. We get in a lot of benefit for a short investment of your time because we know your time is valuable.

However, this could be the most important hour and a half of your week. Even if you are a regular at worship on Sundays, there is little opportunity for fellowship before or after the worship service. Typically, we hurry in as the music plays and shake a few hands on the way out, but there is little time to get to know one another.

I know, our culture tends to dismiss the importance of sitting down and sharing a meal with others, getting to know them and letting them get to know you. Even though everyone has a built-in need for companionship, belonging, affection, emotional support, and validation, today's media tend to glorify independence and the idea, "I don't need anyone," or "I don't want to burden others with my problems."

Nevertheless, we humans have a God-given need for relationships—to be in communication with others. We also have a psychological need to escape our routine, or loneliness, or maybe just watching TV, and be with others—even if you do not know them that well just yet. It can take some courage to venture into the fellowship hall the first time, especially if you are new. Be assured, this friendly bunch will quickly take care of your feeling like a stranger.

Coming to Wednesday night fellowship does not entail a commitment like joining the church or having to come every week. We simply offer this hour and a half as a "spiritual wellness clinic" for all of us who need to share a little time with others. We laugh, share a prayer request or two, eat a meal, and then have an activity.

Eating together with people you may not know that well is not just about food or nutrition. It is a healing moment of being human together and as a people who have the love of God in common. Simply chatting while eating makes you feel connected. Bringing something simple to share, asking about another person's day, and enjoying a laugh together is a worthy investment of your time.

We still meet weekly during the month of May so go ahead and plan to join us every Wednesday night this month at 6 PM. God bless you and I look forward to seeing you there!

SEEKERS SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS New Study: "The Gospels" Starts May 7

Could you explain to someone in a few minutes what the differences are between the four Gospels? Why do we even have four? What is unique about Matthew? What primary audience did Luke have? What stories are in John but not in the others?

Each of the four Gospels reveals a slightly different picture of Jesus. Studying them together can help us understand who Jesus is and what it means to be a follower of Christ. In this study, we will explore how the original context of each Gospel shapes the story of Jesus it presents, as well as how the different Gospel stories influence how Jesus is commonly represented in our culture.
