Statements on Prayer from John Calvin's <u>Institutes</u>. Calvin is considered the Father of the Reformed Faith. Reflect on them and see where the Holy Spirit leads you.

- As faith springs from the Gospel, so by faith our hearts are framed to call upon the name of God (Rom 10:14¹). (3.20.1)
- Let the first rule of right prayer then be, to have our heart and mind framed as becomes those who are entering into converse with God. (3.20.4)
- God promises that he will be near to those who call upon him in truth, and declares that those who seek him with their whole heart will find him. (3.20.7)
- All the passages throughout Scripture in which we are commanded to pray, are set up before our eyes as so many banners, to inspire us with confidence. (3.20.13)
- Hence it is perfectly clear that neither words nor singing (if used in prayer) are of the least consequence, or avail one iota with God, unless they proceed from deep feeling in the heart. (3.20.31)

Scripture Reading Rev. McMahan: John 5:1-13

After this there was a festival of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. Now in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate there is a pool, called in Hebrew Beth-zatha, which has five porticoes. In these lay many invalids--blind, lame, and paralyzed. One man was there who had been ill for thirty-eight years. When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had been there a long time, he said to him, "Do you want to be made well?" The sick man answered him, "Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; and while I am making my way, someone else steps down ahead of me." Jesus said to him, "Stand up, take your mat and walk." At once the man was made well, and he took up his mat and began to walk. Now that day was a sabbath. So the Jews said to the man who had been cured, "It is the sabbath; it is not lawful for you to carry your mat." But he answered them, "The man who made me well said to me, 'Take up your mat and walk.' " They asked him, "Who is the man who said to you, 'Take it up

and walk'?" Now the man who had been healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had disappeared in the crowd that was there.
