From the Interim Pastor:

Remembering Who We Are



During this month of July, I notice that many churches in our presbytery are doing something different for the summer, going from two services to one or planning a sermon series or holding joint worship with other churches. It's summer time, and the living is easy, right? (Actually, I have never found summer time to be any easier than any other time of the year!) But in keeping with this motif, I would like to use the four Sundays of July to preach about worship and about why what we do helps us remember who we are.

Since July 7 is Communion Sunday, the focus of that worship will be on The Lord's Supper. Why is it a sacrament and how would we be different if we did not celebrate it? How does it help us remember who we are?

On July 14, the focus will be on the Prayer of Confession. Some churches prefer not to use such a prayer since it possibly makes people feel badly about themselves, but our Reformed Tradition values such a prayer because it helps us remember who, and whose, we are.

On July 21, we will look at our Affirmation of Faith. While some denominations do not feel a need for the use of Creeds and Confessions, we do. Why is that, and how does affirming our faith together each Sunday help us remember who we are?

On July 28, our focus will be on the Offertory and the Blessing and Sending that ends each worship service. We will look at how those two acts of worship are related and how, again, each one reminds us of who we are.

The world with all its noise is a busy and distracting place. It is easy to become forgetful in all the hustle and bustle and daily concerns of life. I hope these messages will be meaningful to you, and if you know someone who might be interested in hearing them, please invite them to come along.

North Alabama Presbytery Meeting Summary – June 11, 2019 First Presbyterian Church (FPC) Cullman.

St. Andrew Commissioner: Ceil Hydrick

This meeting was one of the best NAP meetings I have attended. It was the right mixture of joyful worship and presbytery business. This was followed by a nice luncheon. We were done and headed home by 1:30pm.

The Rev. David Palmer and the members of Cullman FPC were gracious hosts and made sure to welcome us, serve us lunch, and guide us through the facilities.

Below are some summary items of note from the meeting:

- David Hunsicker and Alison Kling both preached sermons during the meeting. Mr. Hunsicker was approved for ordination and installation as Associate Pastor at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Huntsville. Alison Kling was approved for ordination as Stated Supply at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Huntsville.
- Mrs. Sarah Jane Nixon was certified as ready to receive a call following her completion of her M.
 Div. degree. She has since completed the degree and accepted a call from a church in Virginia.
- The Sa-Rang Korean fellowship was chartered by the presbytery to become a congregation in North Alabama Presbytery.
- The Executive Commission is planning church safety workshops for the fall to be held by geographical cluster.
- The Peacemaking committee will be welcoming a pastor from Russia on September 18-25. Churches are asked to provide speaking opportunities to the committee.
- Camp Maranatha is having a successful summer with about 500 kids attending. Through a partnership with the Boys and Girls Club, 100 kids received scholarships to attend.
- The Youth and Adult Ministry team reports that the Youth trip to Montreat is full for the first time in several years. They are also planning a back to school retreat for 6-12th grade for the weekend of August 9-11. The cost will be \$85 and include ropes course and waterfront activities. The theme will be "Say What? Words Matter".

A training workshop on how to be a welcoming church was presented. The following points were made:

- Websites are important and should be informative with directions, dates, times, etc.
- The first 10 minutes of a visitor's presence at your site are the most important and can determine if they will return.
- Neat landscaping and building make a good first impression.
- Appropriate signage for locating sanctuary, nursery, restrooms, etc. is important.
- Greeters should be engaging and friendly without being overbearing. A greeter ministry is important.
- A welcome center with materials and staffed by a person that can answer questions is helpful. It can be a cart on wheels that is rolled out for worship services.
- Nametags should be worn.
- A clean, safe nursery with well-trained attendants is important for families with children.
- Announcements should be shifted from insider based to visitor based. No "alphabet soup". For
 example, Presbyterian Women instead of PW. Instead of saying meet at Sally's house, be sure to
 identify Sally in the congregation and have people talk to her if they need directions, more information, etc.
- Church bulletins should be informative.

News from the Member Care Ministry: The Shepherd and the Flock

Being an elder in the Presbyterian Church (USA) requires more than simply making decisions about whether to replace a roof this year or next or manage the finances. It also requires being a shepherd, a spiritual caregiver to his/her flock that is composed of you, the church members and friends. As our Book of Order describes: God calls the Church to continue the healing ministry of Jesus Christ, caring for one another, sharing joys and sorrows, providing support in times of stress and need, and offering admonition, forgiveness, and reconciliation. Relying on Christ's grace and the Spirit's gifts, the church seeks to shepherd its members through times of danger and death, illness and loss, crisis and celebration, struggle and sin. Ruling elders, deacons, and ministers of the Word and Sacrament have particular responsibility for the exercise of pastoral care within the community of faith.

Because St. Andrew does not have deacons, the pastor and the elders assume the role of shepherd. They are here to provide support, care, and prayer to this particular flock, and the way this Session is doing so is by creating Shepherd Groups. Each elder has a group of 5-6 members/families under his or her care. The elders' responsibilities are to reach out to the flock, to let them know they have an elder-shepherd, and to be present when needed and as requested.

You will find the Shepherd Groups below and on the bulletin board. Please note who your shepherd is and if you do not know the person, ask the pastor to introduce you. While the pastor tries to be available to everyone, she is part-time and lives out of town, so please do not hesitate to contact your shepherd. Questions? Contact Pastor Rosemary or B.J.
