From the Interim Pastor: ~ Try Something Different!



If you were a parent, do you remember attempting to get your child to eat broccoli or spinach and using those famous, well-worn words, "Just take a little bite. You might like it!" Humans inherently resist change or trying something different, so it's important to remember that the seven deadly words for a church are "We've never done it that way before." Let's shake things up a bit because you just might like it!

Beginning September 4, St. Andrew will resume its Wednesday Night Study for all ages. However, there will be two differences. The first is that the program will begin with dinner at 5:30 PM, and study from 6-7 PM, and the semester will be twelve weeks instead of sixteen. Why these changes? Since most of those who attend the adult study are retired, starting a little bit earlier will get you all home a little bit earlier. It will also make it easier for the children and youth to finish any homework before bedtime, and the reduced semester means your volunteer teachers for children/youth have more flexibility.

The second difference is that along with your study (this fall we will be looking at *Philippians: N.T. Wright for Everyone Bible Study Guides*, available on Amazon.com), we have invited four speakers to come throughout the semester to speak on topics of interest that the Christian Ed Team believes will be meaningful to you. Please see the schedule on page 5 and <u>invite your</u> <u>friends</u> to come hear these experts. This opportunity is a wonderful way to get people into the church, along with giving you a different kind of learning experience.

If you do not wish to participate in the covered dish dinner at 5:30 PM, please still come for the study at 6:00 PM. Most importantly, if you would like to attend any of the Wednesday night events but do not drive at night, please contact Bonita or me and we will find transportation for you.

Try it! You just might like it.

Fall Bible Study: Philippians

This fall, Pastor Rosemary, along with some of the Christian Ed Team, will be facilitating the study of <u>*Philippians: N.T. Wright for Everyone Bible Study Guides*</u> on Wednesday nights from 6-7 PM. According to the description on Amazon.com, "Things don't always go the way we intend. It's easy to feel discuraged because what we hope for is badly thwarted, or because people make life difficult. Paul, writing to the Philippians from prison, certainly knew what it was like to have plans interrupted. But he maintained robust confidence in God's overruling power, even when everything seemed to be going wrong. These eight studies will help us learn from Paul the art of seeing God's purposes working out through problems and difficulties, and they will deepen our own confidence in God's will."

This eight-week study will be complemented by four outside speakers who will be presenting programs on Brain Power "Use It or Lose It"; Aging Gracefully; Elder Law; and Understanding Autism. Watch for more information about the program and the speaker closer to time.

To bring you up to date, the defibrillator has been ordered (thanks to an anonymous donor) and CPR/defib training is scheduled for Sunday, September 8, following our morning worship service.

The Action Team has been trained by the Decatur Police Department, and steps for the congregation to follow in the event of bad weather or an intruder will be presented. A weather radio is in the office and new, updated First Aid Kits are in the main office and in the kitchen.

If you wish to attend the CPR/Defibrillator training on September 8, <u>please let Bonita know or sign-up</u> in the church office by Wednesday, September 4. A light lunch will follow the training session.
