SESSION UPDATES FROM SEPT. 18 MEETING

- 1) Membership status for St. Andrew now stands at 76 following Joanne Wheat being accepted into active church membership by letter of transfer along with Shelley Vinzant by reaffirmation of faith.
- 2) The balance on the church's mortgage is now at approximately \$8,000 after having made the August payment. The projection of paying off the mortgage in October 2019 remains on track.
- The proposed church bylaws were tentatively approved by the session. The bylaws will now be submitted to the congregation for final approval at the congregational meeting scheduled for Oct. 27.
- 4) The session approved the inclusion of the Health/Weather/Safety Plan into the Policies and Procedures Manual.
- 5) An update of the PNC was received.

Committee Reports:

- Administration –We had approximately 20 to 25 members attend the CPR / Defibrillation Training given on Sept. 8 following the church service.
- Buildings & Grounds We are prioritizing and seeking quotes for several long-term capital needs.
- Communications and Outreach –Committee tasks being performed as associated with the Mortgage Burning event and the pole hangers and banner sets will be procured that will be affixed to the light poles at each church entrance.
- Finance Turner Matthews presented a suggested procedure for the budgeting process in developing the 2020 budget.
- Member Care B.J. Breeding summarized the committee's actions in support of the mortgage burning event and went over the invitation list for that event.
- Mission It was noted that Doug Marshall, President and CEO of Presbyterian Home for Children, will be our guest speaker on Sunday, November 10.
- Worship Team Several items of note were mentioned; namely, that Reformation Sunday / Kirkin' O'
 Tartans is scheduled for October 27th. There will be no Hanging of the Greens service this year.

Next stated meeting will be held Wednesday, November 20, at 4:00 P.M.

Health/Weather/ Safety Plan

The initial Health/Weather/Safety Plan has been approved by the St. Andrew Session for inclusion in the Policy and Procedure Manual and is now being implemented. Since the congregation was last informed of the plan, interested members have been trained by the Decatur Police Department on the best ways to respond to an intruder; the Fire Marshal has visited and examined the building; and a First Responder has instructed about twenty-five people on how to use the defibrillator and administer CPR. Security cameras have been installed, a weather radio is in the office, and new First Aid kits are in the kitchen, office, and nursery.

The Task Force has done its job. Now, what do *you* do? In the event of an intruder, fire, or tornado, do not panic. Follow the instructions of the pastor or of an Action Team member who will identity himself and *stay in the sanctuary* unless otherwise instructed to leave. If you have a child in the nursery, the nursery worker also has been trained and has a plan for that child's safety.

In the event of a health issue, again, follow the instructions of the pastor or of an Action Team member. Do not crowd around the sick person, but allow those who have been trained access to him/her. If you do not wish to be resuscitated, you must have a copy of a Do Not Resuscitate order on file here at the church or the EMT's will try to resuscitate you per Alabama Law. A DNR order is different from a Living Will. Any questions about a DNR order should be directed to your doctor.

In the event of upcoming inclement weather, the elders will contact you should the church close for meetings, fellowship events, or worship.

This plan is a beginning. It will be adapted to cover Wednesday nights and other functions as the new minister and session see fit. Any changes will be communicated. On behalf of the session and the pastor, thank you for trusting us with your safety and for your cooperation.


PEACE & GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING WILL BE COLLECTED OCT. 6 on World Communion Sunday

World Communion Sunday is a celebration observed by many Christian denominations around the world on the first Sunday of October. This celebration promotes Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation. It focuses on the observance of the Lord's Supper.

The tradition began in 1933 by Dr. Hugh Thomas Kerr, who was the minister of a Presbyterian Church. Dr. Kerr first conceived the idea of a worldwide observance of communion while he served as moderator of the General Assembly in 1930. This observance, he hoped, would bring churches together in a service of Christian unity in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information and, above all, know the importance of the Church of Jesus Christ, and how all congregations are interconnected one with another. World Communion Sunday was then adopted throughout the Presbyterian Church in 1936, and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches) endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide.

On the same Sunday, we collect the Peace and Global Witness Offering. Your gifts will help more people experience the freedom and dignity that Christ wants for everyone. Let us offer the peace of Christ at all times and however we can.

50% of this offering will stay with our congregation & community and 50% will be for global ministries of peacemaking and reconciliation.

The Protestant Reformation occurred in the 16th Century, splintering Catholic Europe, setting in place the structures and beliefs that define religion in the Modern Era.

Reformers like Martin Luther, John Calvin and Henry VIII challenged Papal authority and the Catholic Church's ability to define Christian practice. In 1517, Martin Luther is said to have nailed the "95 Theses" to the door of the Church in Wittenberg, Germany. The key ideas were that the Bible should be the sole source of spiritual authority and humans may reach salvation by faith and not by deeds. With the help of the new invention of the printing press, the Bible was available to the common people for the very first time in languages they could understand. Before that, they relied on the priest's interpretation of Latin. After a period of 30 years of wars and disturbances, peaceful co-existence between Catholicism and Lutheranism in Germany was finally established. It is estimated that Germany lost 40% of its population during these wars.
