From Pastor Rosemary:

Christ the King Sunday

The special Sunday was designated by Pope Pius XI in 1925, and it entered into the Protestant Church during the 1960's as more and more Protestant denominations began to use the Lectionary (or fixed schedule of readings) each Sunday. At the time of its first observance, Mussolini had been the leader of Italy for three years; an agitator named Adolph Hitler had been out of jail for a year and his Nazi party was growing in popularity; and the world lay in a great depression: a depression that would become far worse. In such upheaval and uncertainty, Pius XI asserted that, nevertheless, Christ is King of the universe. The Church needed to be reminded then. We need to be reminded now about who is worthy of our allegiance and who is Sovereign over all. The liturgical color for this day is white which symbolizes purity, holiness, and virtue, as well as respect and reverence. White is used for all high Holy Days and festival days of the Church Year.

Scripture Reading Rev. McMahan: Luke 23:33-43

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. *Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing."* And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews." One of the criminals who were hanged

there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."
