# From Pastor Tripp:

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same?" -Matthew 5:43-46

It's hard not to look out into the world and despair at the divides that we see. Sadly, it seems as if the divides grow wider every day. Almost every piece of dialogue (especially on social media) has become "Us vs. Them."

- Those who wear masks vs. those who don't
- Those who support monuments coming down vs. those who don't
- Republicans vs. Democrats
- Those who say "Black Lives Matter" vs. those who say "All Lives Matter"

There is so much anger and ugliness surrounding these divisions. Even more heartbreaking is seeing Christians lead the way with vitriol instead of love. We are called to be different, though. We are called to lead the way with love, even with those we may deem "enemies." That's exactly what makes Jesus' words from Matthew so revolutionary, even today.

That doesn't mean that we shouldn't have our own convictions or even that we shouldn't disagree with others. It's only natural that disagreement be present in the world, but the way we approach others is where we are called to be counter-cultural, to take the words of Jesus seriously in our own lives.

In his book, <u>The Magnificent Defeat</u>, Rev. Frederick Buechner claims the following:

"The love for equals is a human thing - of friend for friend, brother for brother. It is to love what is loving and lovely. The world smiles.

The love for the less fortunate is a beautiful thing - the love for those who suffer, for those who are poor, the sick, the failures, the unlovely. This is compassion, and it touches the heart of the world.

The love for the more fortunate is a rare thing - to love those who succeed where we fail, to rejoice without envy with those who rejoice. The world is always bewildered by its saints.

And then there is the love for the enemy - love for the one who does not love you but mocks, threatens, and inflicts pain. The tortured's love for the torturer. This is God's love. It conquers the world."

This is the opportunity we have in this day and time: to help share God's love that conquers the world!
