From Pastor Tripp:

"Be careful then how you live, not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of the time, because the days are evil. So do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is; be filled with the Spirit, as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." Ephesians 5:15-20

Lately I have been trying to take Paul's advice...to be careful how I live, to be wise and not unwise, to make the most of the time. It can be hard, though, can't it? To add on to an already difficult task, Paul ends our selection here by telling the reader and the hearer of this word to give thanks to God *at all times and for everything*!

How in the world does Paul expect us to do that in this day and time? There is so much not to be thankful for! There is division and violence in our country, Covid-19 is still raging, and just among our own congregation, many face tough battles in their day-to-day lives.

While it may be easy to dismiss the thought of "giving thanks at all times and for everything" as naive, remember that Paul himself wrote this letter to the church in Ephesus from prison! Paul himself knew hardship and trouble, and yet he still implores the Ephesians and us to still give thanks. I would imagine that Paul would not want us to ignore the bad or minimize the harshness of life, but to give thanks in spite of it.

With that in mind, I decided recently to try something radical: to take Paul's advice. Every morning for the past few weeks, I have written down a list of the things for which I am thankful. The idea is so simple, but has turned out to be so profound for me. Participating in this new discipline has helped me frame each and every day with gratitude, instead of the alternative of ungratefulness.

On my list each morning has been all of you at St. Andrew. Your support and love for each other and for me has kept us all together even as we have been apart. I am reminded of Paul's words to another church in Philippi, "I thank my God every time I remember you."

Won't you join me in giving thanks?
