From Pastor Tripp:



Retired Methodist Bishop and Pastor, Will Willimon, tells the story of a tribe of Native Americans who lived long ago in what is now the state of Mississippi. They lived along the shore of a rather large river, a river whose current was so swift and strong that it was impossible to cross without being swept away by the powerful current.

As the story goes, one day this particular tribe was attacked by a neighboring tribe and found themselves pinned against the banks of the river. They had two options. They could stay and fight their much larger and much stronger enemy, or they could flee into the river, to certain death.

And despite what they knew of the river, they decided to move out into the treacherous waters. So they gathered the oldest and the youngest, the weakest and the most vulnerable, and they placed them on the shoulders of the strongest and most able. And they began to wade into the water, to what they assumed would be their death. But amazingly, the weight of the oldest and the weakest kept the most able from losing their footing, allowing them to cross safely to the other side.

This solution for saving their tribe is an excellent example for what it means to be "church." Individually, in the strong currents of life, we would perish. In contrast, when we care for and carry one another, we make it safely to the other side. Immediately, I suspect, many of us think of carrying and caring for others! Yet, for each of us, there are times we are the ones who must be carried.

This is what makes St. Andrew such a special place. We take care of each other, and we take care of others. More than anything, I want to encourage you to continue supporting one another, working with one another, and carrying one other as we cross this strong river current of Covid-19. Keep it up, and we'll see each other again soon!

Instant Church Directory is a secure app for viewing our church directory. **ONLY ST. ANDREW MEMBERS** who have submitted an email address to the church office may access this directory. It's a simple way to view and use our directory from your smartphone or iPad. It is always up-to-date, thanks to Bonita. You can use Instant Church Directory to:

View family information and photos (just like the traditional paper version)

Search members to call, email, or text.

Click on member's address to launch your default map app.

There is also a separate tab for our staff members too.

Our church has a paid membership to this service, and only friends/members listed in the directory can gain access. Here's how to download the APP.

Go to the App Store (if your use Apple) or to Google Play (if you use Android).

Search Instant Church Directory – icon looks like this:

Download it – it's free to our church members.



Since you have never logged in it will ask you to **create** Login. It will ask you for your **email address**. You must put the same one that you have given the church to be used in our church directory.

It will also ask you to create a **password**. The password must be 8 characters long and contain at least 2 of the following: cap letters, numbers, or symbols. Then you will retype it to **confirm**.

Should you forget your password later, there's a easy process to set a new one.

That is it. Then it will open, and you will select the buttons for families. They are in alphabetical order.
