"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting...all of them were filled with the Holy Spirit" -Acts 2:1-2, 4a

It seems like just yesterday we were preparing for our first Sunday back in person for Palm Sunday. We then celebrated joyfully as we became witnesses to Jesus' resurrection on Easter morning! It has been such a pleasure to see a sanctuary full of the people of St. Andrew Presbyterian Church.

For so long, we have worried and wondered about when it would be safe to return. Then we had to consider what we were to do to keep everyone safe, and even today those conversations are continuing. There have been so many things to consider when it comes to balancing everyone's safety with the overall health and life of the congregation.

We have focused intensively on ourselves for a long time, and for good reason. That's why I think that Pentecost this year, May 23rd, will be coming at a great time in the life of St. Andrew. We will focus on the Spirit's moving that empowers the church's mission in the world and its testimony of Christ's saving work.

Cláudio Carvalhaes, Professor of Worship at Union Theological Seminary in New York City, says that Pentecost is "a time of being both uprooted and deeply grounded."

Pentecost forces us to look beyond ourselves, even though we have primarily focused on just us lately. While it can feel unsettling, it is the Holy Spirit, like a flame or a mighty wind, that calls us from inward to outward thinking and actions.

We still have a few weeks left in Eastertide, and so I encourage you as you continue worshiping the risen Christ, to keep Pentecost on your radar. All we believe about Jesus' death and resurrection leads us to Pentecost, where we recognize God's sending of the Holy Spirit to aid us in our role as the hands and feet of Christ in the world.

My prayer is that we take the message of Easter and Pentecost to heart, following God's lead here in Decatur and beyond. May it be so!
