### 65 years old is still young!

How old is old? The World Heath Organization (WHO) had declared that 65 years old is still considered young. Before, based on the Friendly Societies Act (1875) in Britain, old was defined by age 50. The UN has not adopted a standard criterion, but lately 60 years old was referred as a border age to the word "old." However, the health organization had done a new research recently, according to average health quality and life expectancy and defined a new criterion that divides human age as follows:

0 to 17 years old: underage

• 18-65 years old: youth or young people

66-79 years old: middle-aged

80 to 99 years old: elderly or senior

100+ years old: long-lived elderly

The following items are highlights from the May 19, 2021 Stated Session Meeting and the May 23, 2021 Called Session Meeting:

- 1) The minutes of the Stated Meeting of March 21, 2021 were approved.
- 2) Our membership as of April 30, 2021 is 74 with the sad passing of both Virginia Wright and Frances Vogel in March of this year.
- 3) Barb Mouton was named to be our Elder Commissioner to the Virtual Meeting of North Alabama Presbytery on June 8, 2021.
- 4) A Called Meeting of Session was scheduled for May 23, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. for the purpose of receiving new Members. (See note 10) below, on that meeting.)
- 5) The Session confirmed three email approvals which had be conducted in the weeks leading up to the meeting. Those approvals allowed: 1) Action Team Training Update, 2) Choir singing from the Loft and 3) Sunday morning Nursery with 2 volunteers.
- 6) Greg Vogel reported that April YTD income is about \$7k below budget, but our spending is approximately \$13k below budget, so we continue to be in very good shape. The Finance team will be meeting to consider how to best utilize the resources we have, since the pandemic resulted in increased reserves for the church.
- 7) Nellie Gates reported that all is going very well as we continue to meet in person and see restrictions being slowly lifted. Virtually all of our regular attendees have been fully vaccinated.
- 8) Turner Matthews indicated that we will be restarting Sunday School Classes during the summer. Stay tuned for exact dates.
- 9) The next Stated meeting will be on Wednesday, July 21, 2021 at 2:00 pm.
- 10) There was a Called Session Meeting on Sunday morning, May 23, 2021 to receive new members: Sheila and Don Koza by Reaffirmation of Faith and Linda and Roger Faulk by Letter of Transfer. They were introduced to the Congregation during the morning Worship Service. With their addition, our membership increased to 78.
