While the Presbyterian Church does not recognize official saints, we instead honor the ordinary, holy lives of believers and loved ones we've lost. During the service, there will be time and space to give thanks for those close to us who have died. If you would like for someone to be included in this time of worship, please let Bonita or me know so that we may recognize them.

As you can see, there is a lot going on in worship this October. We hope that you will be there to celebrate, to remember, and to praise God throughout it all!

Highlights from the September 15, 2021, Stated Session Meeting

The following items are highlights from the September 15, 2021, Stated Session Meeting:

- 1) The minutes of the Stated Meeting of July 21, 2021, and the Called Meeting of August 8, 2021, were approved.
- 2) Our membership as of August 31, 2021, is at 77 with the death of Jane Porter on August 7, 2021.
- 3) Greg Vogel was selected to be our Elder Commissioner to the October 19, 2021, zoom meeting of North Alabama Presbytery.
- 4) Philip Gilbert reported that August YTD income is about \$6900 below budget, but our spending is approximately \$22k below budget, so we continue to be in very good shape. The Mission team will be meeting to consider how to best utilize the resources we have, since the pandemic resulted in increased reserves for the church. If you have any suggestions, please contact Barb Mouton, Chair of Missions.
- 5) Nellie Gates reported that all is going very well as we continue to meet in person and take appropriate measures for members' safety. We will continue to monitor the situation and make adjustments to our policies as required. The next meeting of the Restart Team is on October 6, 2021.
- 6) Bob Naumann advised us that the Building and Grounds committee will be installing piping to carry away water from downspouts to prevent erosion in the area around the south sanctuary entrance, where the tree was removed. After that is done and the ground is sloped appropriately, plants will be added for beautification.
- 7) Turner Matthews reported that restarting Wednesday evening activities will be put off until the first of the year due to COVID.
- 8) Nellie Gates has agreed to be the Chair of the Nominating Committee and they are working to find candidates for office for next year.

The next Stated meeting will be on Wednesday, November 17, 2021 at 2:00 pm.
