"There's no time like the present, and there's no present like time." These are lyrics to a song called "Deadline" by the PC(USA)'s own singer, songwriter, and speaker extraordinaire, David LaMotte. I first heard this phrase around 20 years ago, and it has stuck with me ever since. Advent and Christmastide always heightens my awareness of time.

In Advent, we wait week after week to celebrate Christ's coming. As each Sunday passes, our anticipation grows stronger and stronger as our enthusiasm for Christmas morning builds. Worship during Advent reminds us of the hope, peace, joy, and love that Christ brings, which adds to our already increasing excitement.

We will be donating a significant amount to Habitat for Humanity of Morgan County to help them in their important work in our local communities. Worship Team Notes From Nov. 17 Session Meeting

The St. Andrew Restart Committee has recently relaxed some of our restrictions during worship. These include the following:

- Wearing a mask is now optional. Masks are still available as you enter the building.
- The choir is again seated in the choir loft, leaving an empty seat between individuals.

The following restrictions will remain in place:

- Social distancing between different family groups is requested in the sanctuary, as well as in the halls and narthex.
- Communion will continue with the individual sealed chalices during the coming months.
- The offering plate will remain in the narthex. .
- Congregants will remain in place during the passing of the peace.

During December, the choir will be singing anthems more often, with quest soloists invited.

We celebrated Christ the King Sunday on November 21st, and began Sundays of Advent on November 28th. During Advent we will again light the candles of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. There will be a Christmas Eve Candlelight Service with communion at 4:00 PM. On Sunday morning, December 26th, the service will highlight scripture and music of the season.

Restart Team Revised Guidelines November 29, 2021

- Wearing a mask is optional. However, masks will be available.
- The congregation is encouraged to practice social distancing throughout the building before, during and after the service.
- The kitchen will be opened on a limited basis for groups to bring their own refreshments. No cooking.
- St. Andrew will be open to small groups with the understanding they will sanitize and practice social distancing.
- The nursery is closed until further notice.
- The choir will resume its normal routine for Sunday services with practices remaining in the sanctuary.
- There is no Sunday School for children at this time.
- Communion will continue to use the individual packets.

The following items are highlights from the November 17, 2021, Stated Session Meeting

The minutes of the Stated Session Meeting of September 15, 2021, were approved.

- Our membership as of October 31, 2021, is at 76 with the death of Milton Bridges on September 9, 2021
- Greg Vogel reported that October YTD income is about \$4300 below budget, but our spending is approximately \$26k below budget, so we continue to be in very good shape.
- Nellie Gates reported that all is going very well as we continue to meet in person and take appropriate measures for members safety regarding COVID. We will continue to monitor the situation and make adjustments to our policies as required. The next meeting of the Restart Team is on November 29, 2021.
- Bob Naumann advised us that the Building and Grounds team has installed piping to carry away water from downspouts to prevent erosion in the area around the south sanctuary entrance, where the tree was removed. The ground has been sloped appropriately, and sod has been laid. Plants will be added once selection has been made.
- Terms of the Pastor's Call were discussed (in the absence of Tripp) and will be voted on at a Congregational meeting on December 12, along with election of new Elders and Nominating Committee Members
- Throughout 2021, we have been considering alternatives for utilizing money which has accumulated during the COVID situation (due to underspending because of reduced activities and gains in our assets). We believe that to be good stewards of the blessings which God has given to us that we should find good use for the money and not just build up a bank account. After careful deliberation and prayerful discussion, the Session acted upon a recommendation from the Mission Team and voted to give \$30,000 to Habitat for Humanity of Morgan County. This money will help build a home and will help to sustain the program for years to come, since mortgages paid by Habitat homeowners contribute money back into the system each month to help build future homes. Habitat is currently building its' 94th home in Morgan County over the last 31 years.

The next Stated meeting will be on Wednesday, January 19, 2022 at 2:00 pm.
