

Where does your mission money go?

Just as members are asked to tithe, St. Andrew's budget for missions is at least 10% or more of our annual expenses. About 2/3 of our mission budget is sent to the North Alabama Presbytery for benevolences. The remaining amount is used for local, state, national, and inter-national projects with the an emphasis on supporting local needs.

St. Andrew sends various amounts quarterly to the Committee on Church Cooperation, Neighborhood Christian Center, Hands Across Decatur, Harold Coomer Evangelical Association, Tennessee Valley Outreach, Volunteer Center of Morgan County and the Talladega Children's Home. Yearly amounts are sent to two Living Waters ministries and a purchase is made from the Presbyterian Giving Catalog. This year eight international families received chickens to improve their lives.

Throughout the year, members contribute goods for other projects like school supplies, homeless people, Thanksgiving and Easter meals, Holiday Hope Chests for local children, and groceries for the CCC Food Pantry.

Our church participates in four special offerings each year: One Great Hour of Sharing, Pentecost, Peace and Global Witness, and Christmas Joy. St. Andrew receives 40% of the Pentecost Offering which went this year to buy ukuleles for Austinville Elementary School. Another 25% was received from the Peace and Global Witness offering which was used for local projects.

Although the above covers our mission fund, this doesn't conclude St. Andrew's giving. Groups like the Presbyterian Women, Presbyterian Men, and Caring Hands as well as individuals who support other causes throughout the year.


