

Highlights of the January 19, 2022 Session Meeting

1. The minutes of the Stated Session Meeting of November 17, 2021 and the Congregational Meeting of December 12, 2021 were approved.
2. Our incoming Class of 2024 Elders – Faye Anderson, B. J. Breeding, and Bob Naumann were examined, approved and their Installation is set January 23, 2022 during the morning worship service.
3. Our membership as of December 31, 2021 is at 72 with the death of Ed Wyle on November 18, 2021, and with the Boyd's moving to Indiana and Greg Vogel moving to Birmingham. Since Greg only had the remainder of this year left on his term as a Ruling Elder in the Class of 2022, we have decided to not fill that vacancy and the rest of the Session will handle the business of the church until a full slate of elders is elected for the Class of 2025.
4. The Session approved the 2021 Statistical Report, which will be submitted to North Alabama Presbytery.
5. Harold Culbert will be our Elder Commissioner to the virtual Winter Meeting of North Alabama Presbytery on February 26, 2022.
6. W. C. Sweeley reported on measures that we are taking for members' safety considering the recent hostage situation in Texas and recommendations from Homeland Security. He will make a brief report to the Congregation at our Annual Congregational Meeting later this month.
7. Turner Matthews reported that December YTD income was about \$2400 below budget, but our spending was approximately \$28k below budget, so we continue to be in very good shape.
8. Rev. Brogdon reported that all is going very well as we meet in person and take stronger measures for members' safety regarding COVID. We will continue to monitor the situation and adjust our policies as required. The next meeting of the Restart Team is on January 24, 2022.
9. Bob Naumann reported that burned out lights in the sanctuary and the parking lot have been replaced with LEDs and that a leak in our plumbing system has been repaired. Tom Meier has generously agreed to mow our grounds again for this calendar year.
10. Harold Culbert reported for the Communications Team that we are looking into upgrading our obsolete phone system and improving our internet capabilities for broadcasting our services and the team will be updating our website to reflect our ongoing ministries more accurately.
11. The next Stated meeting will be on Wednesday, March 16, 2022 at 2:00 pm.
