A Message from Pastor Tripp Brogdon:

"And the Lord will guide you continually and satisfy your desire in scorched places and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail." Isaiah 58:11

Along with a new calendar month comes a new liturgical season in the church: Lent. The season of Lent is a time of prayer, fasting, and self-

examination in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of the Lord at Easter. We deeply reflect on Jesus' death and the reconciliation with God that is offered through the grace of Jesus Christ.

"Lent" comes from an old English word for springtime, and so it is no coincidence that this period of 40 days is a time for *growth* through spiritual discipline and commitment as we journey with Christ to the cross.

Thankfully, we, as a community of faith, are promised through the prophet Isaiah that we will be like a watered garden, guided and satisfied by God.

Author Alice Sebold once said, "I like gardening. It's a place where I find myself when I need to lose myself." So it is with us during Lent.

A garden is a delight. It requires hard work, but it also offers a release from the worries of the world. Faith and hope are part of building a garden, as are weeding, pruning, watching, and waiting.

How might we prune our lives to make them more fruitful for God's service? In what ways do faith and hope help you bring your shortcomings to God? How might the fruits of our repentance inspire acts of grace toward one another?

Answering questions like these during Lent will stimulate growth within us, both individually and corporately.

I encourage you to engage with us as we take on this work, through ashes on our foreheads, daily devotions, group study, mission work, and of course, Sunday worship.

We have much to consider and much to do, but with God's help, we will indeed grow... together.
