A Message from your pastor:



The men [in dazzling clothes] said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. - Luke 24:5b-9

He is risen! He is risen, indeed! What a glorious Easter morning we had here at St. Andrew! We sang loudly, rejoiced in the good news of the resurrection, and were blinded by someone's bright, pink coat. I don't remember who it was, but they should have brought sunglasses with them. Don't worry. I'll have a talk with them!

Seekers Sunday School

On Sunday, June 5, the Seekers Sunday School class will begin the study, Words of Life, Jesus and the Promise of the Ten Commandments Today. In this book of scripture and inspiration, Adam Hamilton brings modern eyes to the most famous set of rules in history, recovering the Ten Commandments as more than just a set of onerous prohibitions. He considers the commandments in their historical context, unpacking the meaning of each commandment in Hebrew, how Jesus reinterpreted them, and how Jews and Christians have understood them over the millennia. He also explores how the latest research in science and psychology illuminates these commandments, rightly understood as a way of ordering one's life beautifully in the present day. In a culture marked by workaholism, materialism, and social media-driven envy, God has given us a time-tested path that leads to gratitude, confidence, and peace.
