

**Congregational Meeting** 

For the purpose of approving Elders for Class of 2023

Sunday, December 18, following worship

The following items are highlights from the November 16, 2022, Stated Session Meeting:

The November Stated Session Meeting was held on November 16, 2021, at 2:00 p.m.

- 1. The minutes of the Stated Session Meeting of September 21, 2022, and the Annual Congregational meeting of January 30, 2022, were approved.
- 2. Our membership as of October 31, 2022, is 74. Since our last report, Dan Watt died on October 5, 2022.
- 3. Ceil Hydrick updated the Session on the progress being made by the Commission to discern the future of First Presbyterian Church in Decatur. At this time, no decision has been made to close the church by the Session, the Congregation, or North AL Presbytery.
- 4. Linda Grissom reported on the Fall Meeting of North Alabama Presbytery held at Camp Maranatha on October 18, 2022.
- 5. The Session set the dates for two Congregational Meetings. The first will be on December 18, 2022, for the purpose of hearing the recommendations of the Nominating Committee for Elders and Nominating Committee members for the Class of 2025 and to approve the new Terms of Call for Rev. Brogdon for 2023. The second will be on January 22, 2023 and will be the Annual Congregational to hear reports on the Activities of the Church which were accomplished in 2022 and to present the Budget for 2023.
- 6. Turner Matthews reported that October YTD income was about \$6,100 above budget, and our spending is about \$11,200 below budget, so we continue to be in very good shape. Our total cash and savings are approximately \$236,000.
- 7. Our Restart Team was disbanded with the Session expressing thanks for their work over the last two-plus years. The restriction requiring masks and gloves while serving food was also lifted. Masks will not be required in the church but will be available for those who feel more comfortable with masks.
- 8. Bob Naumann reported that new LED lights have been installed in the hallway between the sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall.
- 9. Starting in January, for the first quarter of 2023 we will be having only two Wednesday Connect programs per month on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesdays. Information on the programs will be announced.
- 10. Barb Mouton reported that Holiday Hope Chests are doing better than ever and collections for Thanksgiving meals are on track for distribution next week.
- 11. Linda Grissom announced we will have a Christmas Brunch on December 18 at 8:45 am, a Christmas Eve service at 4:00 pm on December 24, and a brief service on Christmas morning, December 25, at 10:00 am.

The next Stated meeting will be on Wednesday, January 18, 2023, at 2:00 pm.
