A Message from Pastor Tripp Brogdon:

Holy Week is upon us. Throughout the week, we will experience a whole host of emotions, beginning with the celebration of Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Before we know it, though, the shouts of "Hosanna!" eventually become shouts of "Crucify him!" We will spend time on Maundy Thursday with Jesus and the disciples in the upper room as Jesus washes their feet, gives them a new commandment to love, and serves them the Last Supper. The same night, our Lenten journey with Jesus will come to an end at the cross as he is arrested, beaten, and put to death.

In preparation for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, St. Andrew will be offering the Journey to the Cross experience in the Fellowship Hall once again. I am so thankful to Cerese Sweeley for spearheading the effort once again, and I am thankful for those who have volunteered to help set up in advance.

Here's a special invitation from Cerese, not just to members of St. Andrew, but to the community, as well.

We invite you to come and experience Journey to the Cross with Jesus.

This journey will take you through the last hours of Christ's life, from the Garden of Gethsemane, His Trial, His crucifixion, and His burial, through the ten unique interactive prayer stations.

Your journey is self-paced, and you may stay as long as you like. There will be a chair at each table. This personal experience can be deeply moving and humbling as you come to a deeper understanding of the awful and beautiful sacrifice Jesus made for you.

This reverent experience will be available in the Fellowship Hall: Tuesday, April 4th and Wednesday, April 5th from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Then again on Maundy Thursday, April 6th from 10:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., followed by our Maundy Thursday/Good Friday Church Service at 6:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary.

I can attest that it is indeed an emotional and moving experience, and I know you will feel the same.

As I said, we often experience a wide range of emotions during Holy Week. Thankfully, after our time of mourning is done, we will end Holy Week with unspeakable joy as Jesus is resurrected and conquers the grave! Thanks be to God!

Come and experience it all, the lows and the highs, right here at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church.

The following items are highlights from the March 15, 2023, Stated Session Meeting:

- 1) The March Stated Session Meeting was held on March 15, 2023, at 2:00 p.m.
- 2) The minutes of the Stated Session Meeting of January 18, 2023, and the Annual Congregational meeting of January 22, 2023, were approved.
- 3) Our membership as of February 28, 2023, remains at 73. There were no changes since our last report.
- 4) Stu Strong reported on the February 3, 2023, Called Meeting (by Zoom) of North Alabama Presbytery (NAP) which met to approve the sale of the Church Building and Property of First Presbyterian Church in Decatur. He also reported on the February 25, 2023, Winter Stated Meeting of NAP held at First Presbyterian Church in Athens. The primary highlights of that meeting were 1) the installation of the Rev. Tripp Brogdon as Vice-Moderator of Presbytery, 2) a Celebration of Ministry service for two churches which have closed in our Presbytery: Huntsville Sa-Rang Community Presbyterian Church and First Presbyterian Church of Decatur, and 3) voting on 33 proposed amendments to the PCUSA Book of Order. If you have any questions, please contact Stu.
- 5) Turner Matthews reported that February YTD income was about \$4,100 less than our spending primarily due to paying our entire year's per capita apportionment in January, the purchase of a fire-proof filing cabinet (as recommended in our recent Audit), and 4th quarter 2022 Federal and State Taxes, which were paid in January 2023.
- 6) Bob Naumann told us that 4 new Yoshino Cherry trees were planted to replace old and damaged trees which were removed last fall. We also had some minor roof damage from the storm a couple of weeks ago, which has been repaired. We just had our 10-year inspection to maintain our Termite Bond.
- 7) B. J. Breeding reported that all adult Sunday School material has been organized in the Library and should be consulted prior to purchasing more for your class – you might find something interesting that we have already paid for. Beginning in May, we will be starting a new, weekly Bible study class to be held on Mondays around lunch time – look for more details soon.
- 8) Tripp reported that he will be working closely with Harold and Teresa Culbert to update our website to more accurately reflect our current church activities and membership.
- 9) Faye Anderson advised us that due to the positive responses last year we will have two CATS lunches this year and will again have Shepherd lunch/supper gatherings as well as a church cook-out, and a Christmas Brunch.

10)The next Stated meeting will be on Wednesday, May 17, 2023, at 2:00 pm.
