Member Care Activities

The Member Care Committee invites you to participate in upcoming events.

A CATS' lunch is planned for Thursday, June 8, at 11:30 AM at the Freight House in Hartselle. Specific information and sign-up sheet is in the church office. Everyone is welcome to join us. Food is great (rated #8 in Alabama) and the fellowship is superb.

The Elders will begin scheduling the **Shepherd Group gatherings**. These are times to visit and get to know each other in a small group setting. It is not a structured meeting--just an informal opportunity to share and, of course, eat! When your group meeting is scheduled, please consider joining in.

Session Highlights

The following items are highlights from the May 17, 2023, Stated Session Meeting held on Wednesday, May 17, 2023, at 2:00 PM.

- 1) The minutes of the Stated Session Meeting of March 15, 2023, and the Called Session Meeting of April 23, 2023, were approved.
- 2) Our membership as of April 30, 2023, increased by 2 to 75, with the addition of Ella Stephens and Addi Zeiher by Profession of Faith.
- Faye Anderson was selected to be our Elder Commissioner to the Summer Stated Meeting of North Alabama Presbytery to be held at First Presbyterian Church in Guntersville on June 13, 2023.
- 4) Turner Matthews reported that April YTD income was \$1223 more than expected and expenses were \$656 less than expected. These figures do not include the \$40,000 gift we received from First Presbyterian Church of Decatur. In addition, the Finance Committee made a motion to eliminate the Organ fund and transfer the remaining funds (approximately \$10k) into the General Fund of the Church. In the past 6 months, monies from this fund had been used to purchase a new lawn mower for the church and to purchase a new keyboard for the sanctuary. We expect the keyboard to be used in worship once the final connections are made to our sound system and it becomes fully functional.
- 5) The Session approved a sponsoring relationship with Stacey Nelson to take her under care of St. Andrew after she officially becomes a member of our congregation and as she works to complete her studies at Dubuque Seminary in the next 15 months and then completes her ordination process.
- 6) Bob Naumann informed us that upcoming projects under consideration are the installation of handrails along the hall from the Nursery to the Fellowship Hall, repairs to the Church entrance signage and the water fountain and washing of windows.
- 7) B. J. Breeding reported on the programs being planned for Wednesday evening through the summer. Be on the lookout for more information regarding specific programs.
- 8) Faye Anderson advised us that new Shepherd Lists have been distributed and Shepherd Group Gatherings will be scheduled soon. Two CATS lunches are also being planned.
- 9) The Mission Team received enough money and food that we have some left to carry over to the Thanksgiving meals later in the year according to Barb Mouton. We had a great response to our One Great Hour of Sharing offering and are looking forward to our Pentecost offering next Sunday.
- 10) Linda Grissom reported that we will again be having special music during worship services over the summer months.

The next Stated meeting will be on Wednesday, July 19, 2023, at 2:00 pm.
