Highlights from the Session Meeting

The following items are highlights from the July 19, 2023, Stated Session Meeting:

- 1. The July Stated Session Meeting was held on July 19, 2023, at 2:00 p.m.
- 2. The minutes of the Stated Session Meeting of May 17, 2023 were approved.
- 3. Our membership as of June 30, 2023, changed to 76 by the addition of Sara Bush and Stacey Nelson by Letter of Transfer on May 17, 2023 and with the death of Fate Webster on June 7, 2023.
- 4. The Session met with Grace Nelson (daughter of Stacey Nelson), examined her and received her into membership by Letter of Transfer.
- 5. The Session Conducted an evaluation of Stacey Nelson and voted unanimously to endorse her to the CPM Committee of North Alabama Presbytery as a Candidate for the Ministry. We will be sponsoring and supporting her as she completes her studies at Dubuque seminary and the Ordination process.
- 6. Faye Anderson reported on the Summer Stated Meeting of North Alabama Presbytery which was held at First Presbyterian Church in Guntersville on June 13, 2023.
- 7. Turner Matthews reported that June YTD income was \$1293 more than expected and expenses were \$7895 more than budgeted, primarily due to the church's share of the expenses required to repair the sink hole near Vestavia Drive. Even though income is better than expected, Pledges YTD are worse than budget by \$11,165.
- 8. Bob Naumann reported that the sink hole project has been successfully completed, primarily due to the excellent work by Dave Ellerbe and Bob. He also mentioned that the refrigerator should be repaired by next week and that our sprinkler system is in good shape. We are looking into re-keying the church since we have been in the building for many years and do not have a good record of where all of the keys are now. We will then put in place a system to keep track of the keys.
- 9. B. J. Breeding reported that the movie night was very successful and that her team will be meeting next on July 26, 2023.
- 10. Tripp Brogdon advised that newsletters and bulletins are now available on our website and soon we will have automatic updates of sermons as well.
- 11. Faye Anderson reported that the CATS lunch at the Freight House was well attended and plans are being made for a cook-out and the Christmas Brunch.
- 12. The Mission Team reported that the Pentecost Offering raised \$685 and that we continue to support local charities and that \$1000 was given to help First Presbyterian in Huntsville support a Ukrainian family.
- 13. Linda Grissom reported that the Worship team had accepted an offer of \$500 to buy our old organ (which is not working), and we also saved \$400-500 which we won't have to pay to remove it. We will move a piano to that location for future duets.
- 14. The next Stated meeting will be on Wednesday, September 20, 2023, at 2:00 pm.
