Message from our Pastor:

St. Andrew,

Whenever November rolls around on our calendars, we turn our hearts and minds to the practice of giving thanks... and for good reason! Many of us think that way because of the Thanksgiving holiday, complete with eating far too much and taking the longest nap in the history of the world. I guess I'm just talking about myself at this point, aren't I?

I appreciate the opportunity to stop, to reflect, and to give thanks for the grace of God found in our lives. I am also moved hearing others at this time of year express their gratitude.

This November 5th, we have an opportunity to give thanks in a special way at St. Andrew. We will observe the ancient tradition of All Saints' Day. It is always a moving service of worship, and I encourage you to be present.

All Saints' Day has its roots in early Christian observances that marked an anniversary of a martyr's death - their "birthday" as a saint. By 609 AD, there were so many martyrs that they couldn't all have their own days, so one day was established as an opportunity to honor all the saints, known and unknown.

As time went on, the day began to take on a different focus within our Reformed tradition. As the Presbyterian Mission Agency puts it, "Rather than putting saints on pedestals as holy people set apart in glory, we give glory to God for the ordinary, holy lives of the believers in this and every age."

With that in mind, our focus at St. Andrew will be remembering and giving thanks for our loved ones who have died.

This year, we will provide a flower to each person entering the sanctuary. During the worship service all will have the opportunity to come forward and place their flower near the communion table in memory of our beloved saints who have gone before us. It will be beautiful opportunity to give thanks to God and for our loved ones. Join us so we may remember together.

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God." - Hebrews 12:1-2


