## The following items are highlights from the November 15, 2023, Stated Session Meeting:

- 1. The November Stated Session Meeting was held on November 15, 2023, at 2:00 p.m.
- 2. The minutes of the Stated Session Meeting of September 20, 2023, were approved.
- 3. Bob Naumann and Rev. Brogdon reported on the Fall meeting of North Alabama Presbytery (NAP) which was held at Camp Maranatha on October 17, 2023.
- 4. Our membership as of October 31, 2023, increased to 80 by the addition of Genie and Bob Sparks by Letter of Transfer.
- 5. The Session voted to receive new members by Letter of Transfer. A group of those recently received will be introduced to the congregation within the next few weeks.
- 6. Turner Matthews reported that October YTD income was \$15817 more than expected and expenses were \$8488 more than budgeted, primarily due to the church's share of the expenses required to repair the sink hole near Vestavia Drive. Work is in progress to develop a budget for 2024, which will be presented to the Congregation at a called meeting on January 21, 2024.
- 7. Rev. Brogdon gave us a summary of the training course that he attended in Louisville to prepare him to be the moderator of North Alabama Presbytery next year. The meeting was very useful and involved 130 participants from all over the country. He also gave some insight to the Session of work that we will be doing next year to focus more closely on Spiritual Work and to discern our evolving mission in the Decatur community.
- 8. Bob Naumann reported that trees have been cut down, and dead bushes have been removed. A decision will be made in the spring regarding replacements. A new pump has been installed in the fountain. The worn carpeting at the entrance to the sanctuary will be replaced. Work is in progress to obtain a new heating and cooling system for the Fellowship Hall.
- 9. B. J. Breeding reported that Advent devotionals have been received for each family's use in December. Also in December, Tripp will be leading a three-week Advent Study from 11:30 to 12:30 on Mondays (Dec 4, Dec 11, and Dec 18). We are looking into starting a grief support group within the church within the month of December.
- 10. Faye Anderson reported that we had a very successful Luau in October. and that all the Shepherd groups have met. We are getting ready to decorate the church on December 1, and our Christmas brunch will be held on December 17.
- 11. The Mission Team reported on ongoing activities. Our primary effort in the next week will be to provide Thanksgiving dinners to three local agencies for those in need.
- 12. Linda Grissom reported that Advent will begin on Dec. 3, poinsettias will be placed in the sanctuary on Dec. 10. We will have an abbreviated Service on Dec 24 in the morning and a Christmas Eve service at 4:00 in the afternoon. A worship service on December 31 will be led by members of the congregation since Tripp will be out of town with family.
- 13. The next Stated meeting will be on Wednesday, January 17, 2024, at 2:00 pm.
