

Did you know...

200-275 people are fed hot, nourishing meals provided 4 days per week by volunteer cook teams, or daily volunteers?

30-50 meals are provided to the Alabama Department of Corrections Work Release Road crew?



200 survival bags are distributed with food intended to last each person a couple of days; 100 toiletry kits are distributed; 50 showers; 13 Trauma Support Group participants; 25 computer room users?

Without you, our community, Hands Across Decatur would not exist and our unhoused and underserved would continue to feel like "invisible", "worthless", "hopeless", and "throwaway" citizens.
