VISIONING UPDATE:

St. Andrew,

What a joy it has been to engage in this visioning process as we discern, as best we can, who God is calling us to be and what God is calling us to do in the future.

Your Session and I have been praying, studying, and having honest conversation around what God's will for us might be moving forward. As a part of that effort, we knew that we needed to hear from all of you, the congregation. If you remember, at the end of our catered visioning lunch in July, you answered a series of questions that revolved around who you think we are right now and who you wish we would be and what you wish we would do in the future.

In preparation for the August Session visioning meeting, each and every response was read by each Session member. In the meeting itself, we spent over 2 hours discussing your responses and the themes that emerged from those responses. At the end of the gathering, we put together a list of clear and concise statements about what we learned. They are as follows:

- The congregation identifies itself as loving, caring, and cohesive.
- Our congregation recognizes and appreciates current mission efforts, while desiring to address additional unmet needs in the community.
- There is a disconnect between our desire for more mission and our capabilities.
- While current worship opportunities nurture the spiritual needs of our members, special services have been highlighted as particularly fulfilling.
- There is a desire for more opportunities and times for prayer.
- Our congregation wishes to serve and engage with children, youth, and young adults in our community.
- St. Andrew desires church growth and diversity, particularly young people and families.
- Our family of faith values consistency and longevity in pastoral leadership.
- The members of St. Andrew believe our Christian Education offerings promote spiritual growth.

As author and pastor Frederick Buechner says, "The kind of work God usually calls you to is the kind of work (a) that you need to do and (b) that the world needs to have done. The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."

Thanks to you all, we will be using these clear and concise statements to help guide us to the work that gives us deep gladness and that needs to be done in our community.



MEET THE CHOIR

(So that visitors, new members, and even long-time members of St. Andrew get to know us a little better, this column will feature a different choir member each month. If youlo0ve singing and may be interested in joining with us, visit any one of our choir practices. You're always welcome!)

I am a cradle Presbyterian, and an ordained Deacon and Elder. As an Elder at St. Andrew, I was the first female chair of Building and Grounds. I was instrumental in getting the screen and sound system installed in the fellowship hall. With Harold Culbert, I co-wrote the Sexual Misconduct Policy for St. Andrew. It was adopted by Westminster, Decatur.

Currently, I serve as SAPC's PW Circle Leader, and the PWP Moderator of the North Alabama Presbytery. I established the PW Circle at First Presbyterian, Hartselle. While in my 20's, I organized an intergenerational PW Circle at another church consisting of young working wives and older members who didn't want to be with "just old ladies."

I have sung in a church choir since I was six years old. Currently, I sing with our adult choir. I am one of the backup piano accompanists. At First Presbyterian, Hartselle, I served as pianist/organist/choir director. They sang the anthems in unison with me sometimes joining in. I also have been a accompanist/director for a 5th and 6th grade chorus. (We bribed them with cookies.)

As a child before I could read, I would put all my dolls in a circle at home and give them the day's Sunday School lesson. Sunday afternoons as I grew older, were spent seated at the piano for hours playing first the hymns from the day's bulletin and then learning other hymns. Guess God had plans for me! In the past, I taught 5^{th,} and 8th graders, and then a 4–5-year-old class with my mother. Now, I am one of the teachers for the Seekers class.

My brother, Rev. C. William Allen, was the founding pastor of Bethany Presbyterian Church, Decatur which combined with Covenant to form St. Andrew. While in his 60's and 70's, my dad could be found at the coffee hour after church in a circle surrounded by the teens of the church talking and joking. My mother was very active in PW.
