Something tells me not very many hands just shot up in the air, if any at all. I don't blame you; it has been exhausting for a multitude of reasons.

Nevertheless, it is our duty to participate in the political process, as broken as it seems to be. But as we engage, we must be careful about how we do so.

Our allegiance to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, must always come before our allegiance to a political candidate or party. And our allegiance to Jesus Christ must be our guiding light for our words, our actions, and yes, even our votes.

As you take on this responsibility, I invite you to review "The Christian Voter's Guide" below, written by one of my favorite authors, Brian Zahnd, pastor of the Word of Life Church in St. Joseph, Missouri.

May it help you keep your focus where it needs to be, not just before you vote, but also once all the results are in.

# THE CHRISTIAN VOTER'S GUIDE by Brian Zahnd

- 1. The political process, while necessary, has little to do with how God is saving the world.
- 2. The fate of the kingdom of God does not depend upon political contests.
- 3. Don't be naïve, political parties are more interested in Christian votes than they are in Christian values.
- 4. The bottom line for political parties is power. The bottom line for a Christian is love. And therein lies the rub.
- 5. While in pursuit of the Ring of Power, you are not permitted to abandon the Sermon on the Mount.
- 6. If your political passion makes it hard for you to love your neighbor as yourself, you need to turn it down a notch.
- 7. Your task is to bring the salt of Christian civility to an ugly and acrimonious political process.
- 8. To dismember the body of Christ over politics is a grievous sin.
- 9. Exercise your liberty to vote your conscience and conviction, while accepting that other Christians will do the same and vote differently than you.
- 10. It's more important that your soul be filled with love than it is for your political team to win the game.




**Seekers Sunday School Class**

We have ordered the turkeys and the collection of groceries is in progress at the Donation Station in the church narthex. Each meal will consist of:

Candied Yams - 2 cans ANY SIZE

Cornmeal - 2lb. Bag (or larger)

Dessert Item - 1 box or bag

(if a cake, bring frosting)

**Instant Potatoes - 1 box** 

(no fresh potatoes)
