St. Andrew,

I know what you're thinking... "It's the November Chronicle and Thanksgiving is coming up, so this article of Tripp's will likely be about giving thanks."

You got me! Sort of...

Let's be honest... sometimes we hear the call to "give thanks in all circumstances" (1 Thess. 5:18) and it seems impossible to muster up gratitude. Every year, November rolls around and somehow we're supposed to be grateful while our bodies ache, our relationships strain, and our world feels heavy.

So here's permission to be a cranky Christian this Thanksgiving. Really.

Because here's the thing about biblical gratitude... it's not always sunshine and rainbows. The Psalms are full of complaints, laments, and brutal honesty with God. "How long, O Lord?" appears in scripture far more often than we sing it in worship. Our Reformed tradition has always made room for wrestling with God and for bringing our full selves (grumpy bits included) into the conversation.

Gratitude isn't always about pretending everything is fine. It's also about noticing that even when everything isn't fine, God is still present. Sometimes, it's spotting the small mercies in our lives and in the lives of others. These aren't consolation prizes for a hard year; instead, they're glimpses of grace breaking through.

The apostle Paul wrote about giving thanks from a prison cell... not because prison was great, but because even there, he found God faithful. I think that might just be the cranky Christian's secret. We don't give thanks <u>for</u> everything, but we can give thanks <u>in</u> everything, because God meets us exactly where we are.

So this November, if you're feeling less than cheerful, welcome to the club. Bring that crankiness to God. Be honest about what's hard. And then... see if you can spot one small sign of God's grace in the middle of the mess. Just one... not to fix everything, but to remind yourself that even on the hard days, you're not alone.

Pretty soon we'll gather around the Lord's Table for communion and our own tables for Thanksgiving, with some of us feeling cranky, some of us feeling cheerful, and all of us just showing up as we are. Maybe that's what real thanksgiving looks like, where we come as we are... mess and all... trusting that God will meet us there.

Thanksgiving Meal Collection

We will be providing 50 Thanksgiving dinner kits this year to be divided between the Committee on Church cooperation (CCC), the Neighborhood Christian Center (NCC), The Salvation Army, and Hope Place.

We have ordered the turkeys, and the collection of groceries is in progress at the Donation Station in the church narthex. Each meal will consist of:

- *Corn 2 cans ANY SIZE
- *Green Beans 2 cans ANY SIZE
- *Dessert Item 1 box or bag (if a cake, bring frosting)
- *Candied Yams 2 cans ANY SIZE
- *Instant Potatoes 1 box (no fresh potatoes)
- *Cranberry Sauce 1 can
- *Cornmeal 2lb. Bag (or larger)

We are accepting cash donations to cover the cost of the turkeys, \$20-\$25 per turkey. Also, if you prefer to donate cash instead of purchasing the necessary groceries, the cost per meal for just the groceries will be \$18-\$20 per meal. Just mark your checks "turkeys" or "groceries". The last day to contribute is November 16.


