St. Andrew,

Advent always sneaks up on me. Halloween and Thanksgiving are now in our rearview mirrors, and the world is rushing toward Christmas. In the midst of this holiday rush, the church asks us to wait.

But Advent isn't just about slowing down, though heaven knows we could all use a little of that. Advent is about preparing our hearts for possibly the most astonishing claim of our faith: that God became human. As Eugene Peterson puts it, "The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood." The Creator of the galaxies decided the best way to reach us was to show up as a vulnerable baby.

This is the heart of the theology of the incarnation. God doesn't send instructions from a distance or shout directions from heaven. Instead, God comes close. God takes on flesh like ours, experiences what we experience, and feels what we feel.

I think this is why Advent matters so much, especially in years when the world feels heavy. If this is a year when you're worried about loved ones, when grief sits at your table, when the news exhausts you, or when you wonder if God is paying attention, remember that Advent reminds us that God doesn't love us from afar. God loves us from right next to us. After all, Jesus is Emmanuel, God-with-us, and he has become one of us, entering into our sufferings, our joys, and our ordinary lives.

As we move through Advent toward Christmas, I hope we can resist the temptation to rush. Instead, let's sit with the mystery of incarnation. Let's marvel at a God who thought the best way to save the world was to join it.

The God who showed up in Bethlehem is the same God who shows up here, now, with us. That is worth waiting for, and that is worth celebrating.

# CARING HANDS MINISTRY Meets December 4th ALL ARE WELCOME!



We make cards that will be used to send out hope filled messages to those needing some encouragement or just a little extra "hug" to let them know how much we care about them. The only skills needed will be the ones you learned in kindergarten: cutting and pasting! All supplies are provided. We also knit or crochet shawls for Hospice and the Cancer Institute.

The following items are highlights of the November 19, 2025, Stated Session Meeting:

- 1) The September Stated Session Meeting was held on Wed., November 19, 2025, at 2:00 p.m. In the absence of Clerk, Stu Strong, Linda Grissom was elected as Temporary Clerk.
- 2) The opening devotional on "Love in Action" was given by D. Ann Norris and was based on Romans 12:9-18.
- 3) A Congregational Meeting was scheduled for December 14, 2025, to elect Elders and members of the Nominating Committee for the Classes of 2028. Our Annual Corporation Meeting for the congregation was scheduled for January 25, 2026. At that meeting, the Budget for 2026 will be presented.
- 4) Elder John Jordan presented a report on the Fall Stated Meeting of the North Alabama Presbytery held on October 21, 2025, at Camp Maranatha. The offering collected during the worship service was donated to the Presbyterian Home for Children.
- 5) The minutes of the Stated Session Meeting of September 24, 2025, were approved as amended.
- 6) October year to date income was \$3,179 more than budgeted and expenses were \$2,969 less than budgeted. Our checking and saving accounts increased by \$37,385 since the first of the year. Pledges are coming in for 2026 and elders are working on their committees' budget needs for 2026.
- 7) Building and grounds team cut down and removed additional dead trees and the hedges around the church have been trimmed. Ways to prevent cars from driving on the grass are being considered.
- 8) B. J. Breeding announced the following Connect programs: December 10<sup>th</sup> with speaker Kayla Kretzer from Clothe Our Kids and January 14<sup>th</sup> led by Linda Grissom. Advent Bible studies will be held on December 8<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, and 22nd from 11:30 -12:30.
- 9) Rev. Brogdon will be working on ways to use more social media to increase St. Andrew's online presence.
- 10) Jackie Naumann reported on her Shepherd Group luncheon, and we were reminded that church decoration will be on November 24<sup>th</sup>. Christmas brunch will be on Sunday, December 21, 2025, at 8:45 am and members will be able to sign up to decorate tables.
- 11) John Jordan announced that our Joy Gift Offering will be on Sunday, December 21<sup>st</sup>. We are able to purchase extra turkeys and meals for Thanksgiving distribution due to the generous donations for this effort. The committee visited the Morgan County Child Advocacy Center and were impressed with their work. Barb Mouton presented the committee's goals and plans for 2026. Betty Matthews will do a "Minute for Mission" on the Presbyterian Giving Catalog, and it was reported that our recycling program participation has increased.
- 12)Linda Grissom reminded us of important dates in December including the Christmas Eve service with communion and candlelight. Poinsettias will arrive during the first week of December.
- 13)Rev. Brogdon explained his feelings on the visioning process we have undertaken thus far. He will be devoting time and prayer on how we can reset and continue after the first of the year. The session will be supporting him with our prayers and thoughts on how we can proceed.
