As we enter the season of Lent this month, we are called to a time of reflection and renewal. This year, our journey will be guided by the theme "God on the Move," a sermon series that explores the dynamic and transformative nature of Jesus' ministry.

Jesus didn't stay in one place for long. His earthly ministry was one of moving from one place and encounter to the next. He also moved through every part of the human experience, encountering everything from temptation, to joy, to suffering, and even death. This series will hopefully help us reclaim the movement of Jesus' ministry from temptation to condemnation, through his teaching and miracles, and finally through the story of his death and resurrection. "God Moves Us... to Empty Ourselves" - John 12:1-8

"God Moves... to the Cross" - Luke 19:28-40

The comforting truth of Lent is that as we delve deeper into our own self-examination, we find that we are not alone. God is still on the move in our lives, walking with us every step as we travel the road to Easter. God's movement in Jesus' life inspires and propels our own spiritual growth.

Join us each Sunday as we explore these powerful moments in Jesus' journey. May this Lenten season be a time of profound transformation as we witness "God on the Move" in our lives and in the world.



### Easter Dinner Collection


Our yearly Easter meal collection has begun! A designated area at the Donation Location is set up for the items. Deadline is **Sunday, April 6<sup>th</sup>**. We will be accepting donations to purchase the hams in the church office. Make check payable to SAPC. The donation food list for one meal is as follows (2 cans of any size per meal).

2 Canned Corn 2 Canned Fruit 2 Canned Green Beans 1 Boxed Potatoes

**2 Canned Candied Yams** 

1 Boxed Dessert (if a cake, bring frosting)

This Easter we will be providing Eater dinner kits for 50 families. Each kit will consist of an 8-10 pound spiral cut ham and all the groceries needed to prepare a home-cooked family dinner. The hams are already ordered. We will begin collecting the groceries at the Donation Station outside the Fellowship Hall as well as cash donations to cover the cost of the hams and additional groceries on March 10. The last day for donations will be Sunday, April 4. The cost of each ham will be approximately \$20-\$24. If you prefer us to purchase the groceries for you, the cost for groceries for one meal is approximately \$20. If we have any surplus money after all the costs are met, we will buy and distribute additional meals.
