As we step into a new month, our church calendar invites us on a journey through some important celebrations of our faith. In June, we'll navigate from the hope-filled transition of Ascension of our Lord, into the vibrant celebration of Pentecost, and then arrive at the glorious mystery of Trinity Sunday.

Our journey begins with Ascension Sunday. This isn't a story of Jesus leaving us! When Christ ascends to God's right hand, he isn't abandoning us; he's taking his rightful place as Lord of all creation. This act makes way for an even more intimate presence: the Holy Spirit. 

MEET THE CHOIR



Since then I have taught Sunday School, been an elder, served on various committees, helped with Vacation Bible School, played ladies softball, and occupied a seat in the choir. It has been a pleasure to serve at St. Andrew. Tommy and I enjoy traveling and visiting niece and nephews. Marking things off my bucket list, balloons in Albuquerque, seeing the Grand Canyon, Yellowstone, Glacier National Park, Hawaii, Alaska, Niagara Falls, 49 states and one territory, and various other activities.
